Sanitary Inspection.

The necessity for co-operation between the medical and combatant branches of the service, in connection with the prevention of disease and wider diffusion of sanitary knowledge amongst all ranks, which involves issues, vital to the efficiency of the service, and desirous of bringing Medical and combatant ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~ services into closer communication with each other. Therefore with this in view, and in order to insure method and co-ordination, the following procedure will be carried out:-

- 1 The Regimental Medical Officer will inspect every portion of the Regimental lines, at least once a day, to examine their sanitary conditions. He will keep notes in his sanitary diary. (Para. 134 Regs for Army Medical Service)

3. TRANSPORT:

(a) Separate Transport Requisitions for Passengers, Horses, Equipment, etc., will be forwarded. Officers Commanding units will be held responsible that they are filled in correctly, in accordance with the instructions thereon.

(b) The attention of all officers is directed to K. R. & O. (Canada) 1910, Section XI, paras. 1074 - 1161, concerning movement of troops and transport. These regulations must be strictly adhered to.

3. Transport (contd).

(c) Officers in charge will be held responsible that every precaution has been taken to prevent accidents to the horses of their units, while en route or being entrained or detrained. All horse cars supplied by Railway Companies should be carefully examined, to see that the flooring is sound and dry, and, if possible, sanded; and that there are no nails or other projections which might injure the animals during the journey. The horses should be fed and watered before entraining. Care should be taken that the door opposite the gangway is closed and securely fastened, before commencing the loading or unloading. The horses should be carefully led in, and placed across the car, and tied to the side with their heads away from the second track. The end of the car should be filled first, and then the centre. Each car must be loaded to its full capacity. When loading is completed, the door must be closed and securely fastened. Saddlery and other baggage should be placed on the Baggage Car. Ambulance and other Wagons, shipped by rail, should have their wheels removed, and be packed in as small a space as possible.

(d) In filling in Transport Requisitions, the number of passengers in 'each class', the number of horses, guns, wagon etc., 'weights' of baggage, stores, equipment, etc., must be shown. The Railway or Steam Boat authorities must be requested to furnish the charges for same promptly, so that the O. C. unit may make his return to the Headquarters Office at Sussex, on the day of his arrival in Camp. O. C. units are to be notified that the cost of any cars unnecessarily used by them will be charged against them.

(e) Attention is directed to G. O. 43 of 1910:-

"Transport" : (1) Cavalry:- Each regiment will take into Camp a two-horse transport wagon per squadron, as provided for in the establishments.

(2) Field Artillery : Fd. Arty. Transport will be as laid down in establishments for Field Artillery, with the addition of one farmer's wagon per battery, but without horses; the horses being supplied from the Battery detail. With this additional wagon, and the G.S. Wagon already authorised, all Field Artillery units will be required to supply their own transport, for all purposes. See also Para. 1147 K.R. & O. 1910.

4. CAMP EQUIPMENT: O.C. units will requisition, with least possible delay, for Camp Equipment required, as laid down in Regulations for the Equipment of the Canadian Militia, Part I, 1908, Sect. III "Camp Equipment", and Appendix IV. This detail will be strictly adhered to.

5. Pay, etc. Particular attention is directed to the regulations laid down in "Memo. for the Training of the Canadian Militia and Notes for Administration of Camps, 1910", regarding Service Rolls, Pay, Exemptions, Musketry, Efficiency Pay, etc., especially XVI, pages 52 to 58. and, also, to Pay & Allowance Regulations, 1907, paras. 232, 233, 235, 251, 252 and 253, relative to Fitting of Harness, Inspection of horses, marching and wagon allowances. O. C. units will notify all officers concerned, in their commands, of these regulations.

6. ADVANCE PARTIES: O.C. units will, in compliance with "Memo. for Training, etc." and "Pay & Allowance Regns". paras. 228 - 230, detail the Officer, N. C. O. and men of the units under their command, as advance parties, to proceed to Camp to arrive Monday, 27th June, 1910.

As soon as all the advance parties of a Regiment have arrived at Camp site, the Qr. Mr. will assume charge, and make out a nominal roll, shewing the name, Squadron, Battery or Company, to which the several members of the party belong. This roll, immediately on completion, will be handed to the D.A.A.G. who, on checking it over, will countersign it, stating the hour of its receipt, and forward it to the Camp Paymaster. Returns will be prepared by the Vet. Officer, giving particulars of every horse examined, and if found fit or otherwise, and forwarded to the D.A.A.G., attached to Marching-In-States. The chargers of mounted officers of dismounted units will be inspected immediately on their arrival in camp, by the Vet. officer of the 8th Hussars, who will send in a similar return.

8. Shoeing HORSES, In CAMP: Officers Commanding Cavalry Regiments, Arty. Brigades and A. S. C. units will take such steps as may be necessary to ensure being brought into camp at least one qualified Shoeing Smith, and will arrange to have requisitions submitted, without delay, for the number of shoes, and proportion of sized required.

9. BAGGAGE: In proceeding to camp, the following weights of Baggage will be allowed:-

13. FORMS: Militia Form B 215 (Marching-in-States) and other necessary blank forms are being sent to O. C. units. The Marching-in-States are to be correctly filled in by Companies, in the first place, and handed to the Adjutant, who, as soon as the regiment is concentrated, make up his Regimental State.

14. HAIR: O. C. units are held responsible that the hair of N. C. O. and men under their command is closely cut.

Efficiency Pay: The following regulations regarding Musketry must be strictly adhered to:-

O. C. Companies must see that men are on the range at the hour stated in orders. The timetable will be followed as closely as circumstances of weather, etc., permit. Companies missing range practice at stated hour will report on the range Thursday, July 7th, as per timetable, unless otherwise notified.

O.C. Companies will warn their men against impersonation at the range. This is a punishable offence for both parties concerned. All men failing to qualify for any efficiency pay will be allowed a second trial, but they must endorse their score sheets before leaving the range. When they present themselves for second trial, they must sign the same again.

Judging distance practice will be carried on at the Hut.

Companies presenting themselves late at the Sub-target and Aiming Drill will not, on this account, present themselves late at the Range. N. C. Os. at Marquee will dismiss such Companies in time to march to the range on schedule time.

Attention is called to G.O. 58 of 1909, and amendment thereto be G.O. 12 of 1910, regarding the bearing of Musketry Practice upon the issue of Efficiency Pay to men of Cavalry and Infantry units; and, as it is essential to the issue of pay that Camp Paymasters should receive properly authenticated Target Practice Returns as soon as possible after each Regiment completes its shooting. The following instructions are to be carefully noted and carried out by all concerned:-

1.- As soon after arrival in camp as possible, officers in command of Squadrons or Companies are to prepare a complete list, in duplicate (triplicate if one copy is retained by O.C. units) of their N. C. O. and men on Target Practice Return, Form B. 282, and certify to the correctness of the same at the bottom thereof. This list is to include the name of every man, whether exempt from Range Practice or not. These forms are to be forwarded to the Camp Paymaster, to be passed by him to the Camp Musketry Instructor for completion as the shooting progresses. Officers Commanding will ascertain from Camp Musketry Instructor that he has the lists, before sending men to range.

2.- Individual Score Cards (Form B. 372) will be used at the firing points and these will be retained by the Camp Musketry Instructor who, at the conclusion of each day's Musketry Practice will transcribe the Scores recorded thereon to the Target Practice Returns referred to in para. 1. It is important, therefore, that the name of each N. C. O. and man should be correctly recorded on those Individual Score Cards with the Squadron or Company, and Regiment, to which he belongs.

3.- As an Officer of each Squadron or Company must be present when his men are firing, he should obtain the scores made by each man before leaving the Range and keep a record of each man's score. He will make a special note of those men who have failed to obtain the requisite score for qualification. He will be responsible that these men are paraded at the Ranges for a second trial when warned.

4.- As each Regiment completes practice at 100 and 200 yards the Camp Musketry Instructor will return to the Camp Paymaster one copy of the Target Practice Returns referred to in para. 1 with all scores duly recorded thereon, and the whole properly certified to. He (the Camp Musketry Instructor) is responsible that the forms used for this purpose are the particular ones originally received through the Camp Paymaster, and he will retain one copy from which to compile the regular Musketry Returns.

5.- In the case of men who have "failed" at their first attempt, and who afterwards present themselves for a second trial a separate return will be made on Form B. 282 for each Regiment, the Squadron or Company of each man being clearly stated.

6.- For those N. C. O's and men on the Regimental Staff who are not exempt from Musketry Practice, a similar procedure to above, will be followed.

Efficiency Pay, N. C. O's & men

exempt from Musketry.

For all those N. C. O's and men who are exempt by G. O. 58 of 1909 from Musketry Practice, particulars as to previous service, and rates of Efficiency Pay to which they are entitled, will be recorded on Efficiency Pay Roll, Form D. 822 (New issue) and forwarded to the Camp Paymaster with the Pay Lists. One form only (in duplicate) for the whole Regiment will be necessary -- the unit to which the N. C. O. or man belongs being duly recorded.

Qualification of N. C. O's.






Musketry & Efficiency Pay.

The following Regulations regarding Musketry must be strictly adhered to:-

O.C. Companies must see that men are on the range at the hour stated in orders. The time table will be followed as closely as circumstances of weather, etc, permit. Companies missing range practice at stated hour will report on the range at days to be notified later.

O.C. Companies will warn their men against impersonation at the range. This is a punishable offence for both parties concerned. All men failing to qualify for any efficiency pay will be allowed a second trial, but they must endorse their score sheets before leaving the range. When they present themselves for second trial, they must sign the same again.

Judging distance practice will be carried on at the Hut. Companies presenting themselves late at the Sub-target and Aiming Drill will not, on this account, present themselves late at the Range. N.C.O.s at Marquee will disallow such Companies in time to march to the range on schedule time.

Attention is called to G.O. 58 of 1909, and amendment thereto by G.O. 12 of 1910, regarding the bearing of Musketry Practice upon the issue of Efficiency Pay to men of Cavalry and Infantry Units; and, as it is essential to the issue of pay that Camp Paymasters should receive properly authenticated Target Practice Returns as soon as possible after each Regiment completes its shooting, the following instructions are to be carefully noted and carried out by all concerned:-

1.- As soon after arrival in camp as possible, Officers in Command of Squadrons or Companies are to prepare a complete list, in duplicate (triplicate if one copy is retained by O.C. Units) of their N.C.O. and men on Target Practice Return, Form B.282, and certify to the correctness of the same at the bottom thereof. This list is to include the name of every man, whether exempt from Range Practice or not. These forms are to be forwarded to the Camp Paymaster, to be passed by him to the Camp Musketry Instructor for completion as the shooting progresses. Officers Commanding will ascertain from Camp Musketry Instructor that he has the lists, before sending men to range.

2.- Individual Score Cards (Form B.372) will be used at the firing points and these will be retained by the Camp Musketry Instructor who, at the conclusion of each day's Musketry Practice, will transcribe the Scores recorded thereon to the Target Practice Returns referred to in para. 1. It is important, therefore, that the name of each N.C.O. and man should be correctly recorded on those Individual Score Cards with the Squadron or Company and Regiment, to which he belongs.

3.- As an officer of each Squadron or Company must be present when his men are firing, he should obtain the scores made by each man before leaving the Range and keep a record of each man's score. He will make a special note of those men who have failed to obtain the requisite score for qualification. He will be responsible that these men are paraded at the Ranges for a second trial when warned.

4.- As each Regiment completes practice at 100 and 200 yards the Camp Musketry Instructor will return to the Camp Paymaster one copy of the Target Practice Returns referred to in para. 1, with all scores duly recorded thereon and the whole properly certified to. He (The Camp Musketry Instructor) is responsible that the forms used for this purpose are the particular ones originally received from the Camp Paymaster, and he will retain one copy from which to compile the regular Musketry Returns.

- 5.- In the case of men who have "failed" at their first attempt, and who afterwards present themselves for a second trial, a separate return will be made on Form B.202 for each Regiment, the Squadron or Company of each man being clearly stated.
- 6.- For those N.C.O.s and men on the Regimental Staff who are not exempt from Musketry Practice, a similar procedure to above, will be followed.
- 7.- For all those N.C.O.s and men who are exempt by G.O.58 of 1909 from Musketry Practice, particulars as to previous service, and rates of Efficiency Pay to which they are entitled, will be recorded on Efficiency Pay Roll, Form D.822 (New issue) and forwarded to the Camp Paymaster with the Pay Lists. One form only (in duplicate) for the whole Regiment will be necessary - the unit to which the N.C.O. or man belongs being duly recorded.

8. Qualifications of N.C.O.s. Attention is called to G.O.52(3) of 1st April, 1910, regarding the qualifications required by N.C.O.s before they are permitted to draw the rate of pay for the rank held. Officers Commanding Regiments, Squadrons and Companies are required to see that all N.C.O.s are qualified as called for in the G.O. quoted, and the evidence in support of same produced before allowing pay for the rank to be claimed.

10. Exemptions Musketry. The following N.C.O.s and men are exempt from Musketry:-



No. 27. MUSKETRY TRAINING PROGRAMME.

The Programme of Musketry Training, for Sussex Camp, 1912, is issued, herewith, to Commanding Officers and all concerned.

No. 28. MUSKETRY PLACES OF PARADE.

All musketry instruction, both preliminary and range practice, will be carried out on the ranges.

No. 29. MUSKETRY - SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS.

The following regulations regarding musketry must be strictly adhered to :-

(a). Units must be at the places named in the programme at the hour stated. The time table will be followed as closely as circumstances of weather &c. permit. Companies missing range practice at stated hours will report on the range at days to be notified later.

(b). O.C. Units will warn their men against impersonation at the range. This is a punishable offence for both parties concerned. All men failing to qualify for efficiency pay will be allowed further trials, but they must endorse their score sheets before leaving the range. When they present themselves for further trial they must sign the same again.

(c). Judging Distance Practice will be carried out on the ranges before range practice. O.C. Companies will fill in Militia Form B.298, (Register of Judging Distance Practice), before going to the range, and will bring them with them and ~~hand~~ hand to the Camp Musketry Instructor on the range.

(d). Units presenting themselves late at the Sub-target and Aiming Drill will not, on this account, present themselves late at the range. N.C.Os. at Marquee will dismiss such units in time to march to the range on schedule time.

(e). When portions of a company parade on the range for preliminary musketry instruction, they will be accompanied by at least one company officer.

(f). Regimental Musketry Instructors will always be with the Company of their regiment that is firing on the range.

(g). Small Arm Ammunition for Musketry Practice will be drawn by the Musketry Instructor and will be issued by him on the range to the individual units.

The Musketry Instructor will be responsible for the return of all unexpended ammunition and at least 90% of the empty fired cartridge cases.

NO. 29. MUSKETRY - SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS, (Continued).

- (h). Officers Commanding Companies will examine arms and pouches before proceeding to and leaving range.
- (i). Officers Commanding Regiments are responsible that all employed men whose efficiency pay depends on their musketry qualifications are present at the range with their companies. Failure to comply with this order will result in the men losing their efficiency pay.
- (j). The Sub-target gun erected near the Y.M.C.A. Marquee is for voluntary practice at any hour. All ranks are invited to make as much use of it as possible.

NO. 30. MUSKETRY RETURNS AND EFFICIENCY PAY.

As soon as possible after arrival in Camp, Officers in command of companies are to prepare a complete list IN DUPLICATE, (TRIPLICATE if one copy is to be retained by the Officer Commanding Unit), of their N.C.Os. and Men on Target Practice Return, (M.F. B.282), and certify to the correctness of same at the bottom thereof, (These forms can be obtained from the Musketry Instructor on application at the Camp Headquarter Office).

This list is to include the name of every man, whether exempt from range practice or not. These forms are to be forwarded to the Camp Musketry Instructor for completion as the shooting progresses. Officers Commanding will ascertain from the Camp Musketry Instructor that he has the lists, before sending men to range.

Officers Commanding Regiments will also forward a complete list, (IN DUPLICATE) of all N.C.Os. & Men on Staff Pay List.

(b). Attention is called to Articles 336 to 348, inclusive, Pay & Allowance Regulations, 1912, regarding the bearing of Musketry Practice upon the issue of Efficiency Pay to men of units; and, as it is essential to the issue of pay that Camp Paymasters should receive properly authenticated target practice returns as soon as possible after each regiment completes its shooting, the following instructions are to be carefully noted and carried out by all concerned :-

(c). Individual Score Cards, (M.F. B.372), will be used at the firing points, and these will be retained by the Camp Musketry Instructor, who, at the conclusion of each day's musketry practice, will transcribe the scores recorded thereon to the Target Practice Returns referred to above. It is important, therefore, that the name of each N.C.O. and Man should be correctly recorded on the individual score cards, with the company and regiment, to which he belongs.

(d). As an officer of each company must be present when his men are firing, he should obtain the scores made by each man before leaving the range and keep a record of each man's score. He will make a special note of those men who have failed to obtain the requisite score for qualification. He will be responsible that these men are paraded at the ranges for a second trial when warned.

(a), with all scores duly recorded thereon and the whole properly certified to. He (The Camp Musketry Instructor), is responsible that the forms used for this purpose are the particular ones originally received through the Camp Paymaster, and he will retain one copy from which to compile the regular monthly returns.
- (f). In the case of men who have failed at their first attempt, and who afterwards present themselves for a second trial, a separate return will be made on Form D.282 for each Regiment; the company of each man being clearly stated.
- (g). For those N.C.O.s & Men on the regimental staff who are not exempt from musketry practice, a similar procedure to above, will be followed.
- (h). For all those N.C.O.s. and Men who are exempt by Article 340, Pay and Allowance Regulations, 1912, particulars as to previous service, and rates & of efficiency pay to which they are entitled will be recorded on efficiency pay rolls, M.F. B822, and forwarded to the Camp Paymaster with the Pay List. One form only (IN DUPLICATE) for the whole regiment will be necessary - The unit to which the N.C.O. or Man belongs being duly recorded. It is to be distinctly understood, however, that, in event, of the N.C.O.s. & Men failing to qualify in Musketry, they will not be permitted to qualify for their Efficiency under the head of Exemptions.

- (i). Special attention is drawn to "Instructions for Training, Active Militia, 1912", issued with Militia Order 38 of the 27th. January, 1912.
